



Timely Warning Notification: Motor Vehicle Theft (Electric Scooter)

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The Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act (Clery Act) is a federal law that requires colleges and universities across the United States to disclose information about crime on and around their campuses. A requirement of this law is timely notification to the campus community of certain crimes in a manner that will aid in the prevention of similar crimes.

Motor Vehicle Thefts – Electric Scooters

Electric scooter thefts are classified as Motor Vehicle Theft under the Clery Act. These thefts occur intermittently throughout the year, with a higher volume at the beginning of the new academic year. As of 9/1/26 reports continue of electric scooters stolen from bike racks, residence hall areas, and locations near academic buildings when left unattended or unsecured.

University Police investigates these incidents and has increased patrols in high-risk areas. If your scooter has been stolen, report it to UPD as soon as possible so the incident can be documented, investigated, and included in required Clery Act statistics.

- Be a good neighbor. If you notice anything suspicious in your neighborhood, call 9-1-1 immediately.
- Secure Your Scooter: Always use a high-quality U-lock or chain lock to secure your electric scooter to a fixed bike rack.
