



Timely Warning Notification: Aggravated Assault

August 26, 2026

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The Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act (Clery Act) is a federal law that requires colleges and universities across the United States to disclose information about crime on and around their campuses. A requirement of this law is timely notification to the campus community of certain crimes in a manner that will aid in the prevention of similar crimes.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Late on August 25, 2026, the University Police Department was made aware of an incident that occurred just after 9 P.M. on August 25, 2026. The incident was reported to have occurred in Zone 16W parking lot.

Two victims reported that an alleged suspect had brandished a firearm while accusing them of cutting him off in traffic. The subject has not been identified at this time but was described as a white male, approximately late 20's to early 30's, with a dark brown beard, wearing a red plaid shirt and driving an early model 2000's Red or possible Maroon Ford Extended Cab Pickup with stickers in the passenger rear window.

Crime victim rights and options were provided. Title IX is aware of the reported incidents.

WTAMU and the University Police strongly encourage everyone to use good judgement and be an active player in your own safety. Review the following prevention strategies related to fighting and arguments:

- Verbal provocation alone is not justification to assault a person
- Do not provoke others with words or actions
- Call 9-1-1 immediately
- Protect yourself in an aggressive situation by keeping your doors locked and windows up
