West Texas A&M University TUITION REBATE PROGRAM Request for Rebate - Student Information

West Texas A&M University is pleased to inform you that you may qualify for up to \$1,000 tuition rebate once you receive your baccalaureate degree. The Tuition Rebate program, authorized by Section 54.0065 of the Texas Education Code, provides tuition rebates of up to \$1,000 as a financial incentive for Texas students to prepare for university studies while completing their high school work, avail themselves of academic counseling, make early career decisions, and complete baccalaureate studies with as few courses outside the degree plan as possible. Minimizing the number of courses taken by students results in financial savings to students, parents, and the state.

To be eligible for rebates under this program, students must meet <u>all</u> of the following conditions:

- (1) Must have enrolled for the first time in an institution of higher education in the fall 1997 semester or later;
- (2) Must be requesting a rebate for work attempted while seeking a first baccalaureate degree received from a Texas public university;
- (3) Must have been a resident of Texas and have been entitled to pay resident tuition at all times while pursuing the degree;
- (4) Must have attempted no more than three hours in excess of the minimum number of semester credit hours required to complete the degree under the catalog under which they were graduated. Hours attempted include transfer credits, course credit earned exclusively by examination in excess of nine semester credit hours, courses that are dropped after the official census date, for-credit developmental courses, optional internship and cooperative education courses, repeated courses, and correspondence/extension courses. Courses dropped for reasons that are determined by the institution to be totally beyond the control of the student shall not be counted;
- (5) Must apply for rebates on forms provided by the appropriate Dean's office prior to receiving their baccalaureate degrees and keep the Registrar apprised of their addresses for at least 60 days after their graduation date; and
- (6) If enrolled for the first time in Fall 2005 and after, must graduate within four calendar years for a four-year degree or within five calendar years for a five-year degree.

- *Reduced by the amount of outstanding student loans.
