One-Week Show Requirement

All studio majors are required to have a one- or two-person, one-week show featuring work from their ARTS 4394 senior project. The student will be responsible for design and mounting of the show, arrangements for publicity through the University's Office of Communication and Marketing Services and The Prairie student publication, and handling invitations. An opening reception is optional. Each student will undergo a critique of the show by a committee of three or more faculty (the student's faculty adviser and at least two additional faculty members from the department).
