

## **Timely Warning Notification: Fondling**

The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act (Clery Act) is a federal law that requires colleges and universities across the United States to disclose information about crime on and around their campuses. A requirement of this law is timely notification to the campus community of certain crimes in a manner that will aid in the prevention of similar crimes.

## **FONDLING**

On January 21, 2025, the University Police Department (UPD) received a report of fondling that occurred on January 19, 2025, between 4:00 – 6:00 PM. The offense was reported to have occurred in the oncampus academic building, Mary Moody Northen Hall.

The Title IX Office is aware of the incidents. Local and university resources are being made available to the victim.

- Make sure you have consent. Consent is a clear and freely given yes, not the absence of a no.
- Unwanted touching such as groping and touching of private body parts is inappropriate touching.
- Trust your instincts. If you feel uneasy or sense something is wrong, call for assistance.
