

Timely Warning Notification: Fondling

The Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act (Clery Act) is a federal law that requires colleges and universities across the United States to disclose information about crime on and around their campuses. A requirement of this law is timely notification to the campus community of certain crimes in a manner that will aid in the prevention of similar crimes.

FONDLING

On March 31, 2025, the University Police Department (UPD) received a report involving a group of juveniles on campus. It was reported that two juvenile victims were touched inappropriately while visiting the pool at the Activity Center. The incident was reported to have occurred between 3:30 PM and 5:30pm on March 30, 2025.

UPD has provided Notice of Victim's Rights & Options and will follow up with the appropriate process for working with juveniles.

- Talk to your kids about inappropriate touching and safe resources for your child.
- Unwanted touching such as groping and touching of private body parts is inappropriate touching.
- Children cannot give permission or consent to sexual contact.
- Bystanders play a critical role in the prevention of sexual violence. Make the choice to intervene, speak up, or do something about it.
