NOTE I: At least 39 hours of advanced work (3000- or 4000-level courses) for which tuition is paid must be earned at WTAMU, and 30 of the final 36 hours counted toward the degree must be earned at WTAMU. A maximum of six semester hours in religion and six semester hours in physical education (PHED) courses can count toward a baccalaureate degree.

# **OPTION 1: PROFESSIONAL PSYCHOLOGY**

The Professional psychology option follows recommendations from nationwide graduate programs & prepares students to pursue a master's or a doctorate degree in various psychology specializations.

Graduate specializations recommendations: BIOL 1406/L & 1407/L (lab science core); BIOL 2401/L & 2402/L (BS requirement); SOCI 1301 or ANTH 2351. Clinical or counseling psychology recommendations: PSYC 4360, 4355, 4361, 3371 & 3350; SOCW 2361; CD 2373.

Forensic psychology recommendations: PSYC 3373, 3350, 4335 & 4360; COMM 1321 & 3303; PHIL 2303, CRIJ 1306, 3322 & 2328; SOCI 3370, 3374 & 4302. Neuroscience recommendations: PSYC 3320 & 4324; CHEM 1411, 1412, 2523 &

### **OPTION 2: GENERAL PSYCHOLOGY**

The General Psychology Option provides a background for students whose career goals are in psychology-related fields (e.g., entering law school or the ministry) and not in becoming a psychologist.

Recommended courses: SOCI 1301 & 1306; ANTH 2351.

Note: This is NOT a degree plan. After completing 30 hours, students are encouraged to request an official degree plan by using the online Request for a Degree Plan form. If unable to use the online form, students can also submit a request in Old Main, Room 424 (or call 806-651-2668). Students who have completed 45 hours will not be allowed to progress without requesting a degree plan.
