Upon completion of the WTAMU Pre-Nursing admission requirements, there is a second, competitive application process to be admitted to the BSN program. A basic or transfer student who is not enrolled in courses in one of the four official nursing semesters (Junior I, Junior II, Senior I, and Senior II) is considered to be a Pre-Nursing major, Code 700. When a student is admitted to the WTAMU BSN program and begins Junior I nursing courses, the major code is changed to Code 701, unless the student is a registered LVN, in which case the major is changed to 713.
