West Texas A&M University Cooperative Education / Internship Program Fall 2005 Executive Summary

The co-op / internship program at WTAMU began in the spring of 1994. A Title VIII Department of Education grant started the program and placed the first students in the spring of 1994. Our vital statistics to date include:

- Monitored 1265 individual placements to date (45 in Fall 2005)
- ➤ Placed 586 students in paid internships / co-op jobs (unduplicated count)
- ➤ Average GPA of the Fall 2005 class 3.204
- Average wage for the Fall 2005 class \$10.45 per hour
- > Total dollars earned by the Fall 2005 class \$121,642
- > Total dollars earned by all co-op / internship students to date \$4,124,220

In the academic year to date, the co-op / internship program has also helped 431 students through both online and in-person résumé workshops. Additionally, our counselors have provided career counseling to 149 students to date during the 2005-06 school year. This counseling and guidance helps students determine their best career path.

This semester 7 of our 45 interns placed graduated. Five found full-time positions, one is attending graduate school, and one is still seeking employment.
