WTAMU Experiential Education Program Fall 2008 Executive Summary

The Experiential Education program (formerly Cooperative Education) began in the spring of 1994. A Title VIII Department of Education grant started the program, and we placed the first students in the spring of 1994. Our vital statistics to date include:

- Monitored 1,681 individual placements to date (47 in Fall 2008)
- Placed 722 students in paid internships (unduplicated count)
- ➢ Average GPA of the Fall 2008 class − 3.16
- Average wage for the Fall 2008 class \$10.78 per hour
- ➤ Total dollars earned by the Fall 2008 class \$156,056
- > Total dollars earned by all internship students to date \$5,695,681

To date in the 2008-09 academic year, the Experiential Education & Career Services program helped 376 students through both online and in-person résumé workshops. Additionally, our counselors have provided career counseling to 93 students so far in this academic year. This counseling and guidance helps students determine their best career path.
