WTAMU Experiential Education Program Spring 2010 Executive Summary

The Experiential Education program (formerly Cooperative Education) began in the spring of 1994. A Title VIII Department of Education grant started the program, and we placed the first students in the spring of 1994. Our vital statistics to date include:

- ➤ Monitored 1,832 individual placements to date (47 in Spring 2010)
- ➤ Placed 819 students in internships (unduplicated count)
- ➤ Average GPA of the Spring 2010 class 3.14
- ➤ Average wage for the Spring 2010 class \$10.63 per hour
- > Total dollars earned by the Spring 2010 class \$197,902
- Total dollars earned by all internship students to date \$6,362,329

To date in the 2009-10 academic year, the Experiential Education & Career Services program helped 1,058 students through both online and in-person résumé workshops. Additionally, our counselors have provided career counseling to 134 students so far in this academic year. This counseling and guidance helps students determine their best career path.

Intern to Full-Time for Spring 2010

This semester 15 out of our 47 interns graduated. Three took full-time jobs while they finish their graduate work. All of these students are listed on the chart below.

Of these students, 56% have full-time jobs—5 with their intern employers and 5 with other employers. Seventeen percent (17%) are pursuing graduate or law school and 28% are seeking full-time employment.
