WTAMU Experiential Education Program Summer 2009 Executive Summary

The Experiential Education program (formerly Cooperative Education) began in the spring of 1994. A Title VIII Department of Education grant started the program, and we placed the first students in the spring of 1994. Our vital statistics to date include:

- Monitored 1,784 individual placements to date (52 in Summer 2009)
- Placed 779 students in paid internships (unduplicated count)
- ➢ Average GPA of the Summer 2009 class − 3.13
- Average wage for the Summer 2009 class \$12.46 per hour
- > Total dollars earned by the Summer 2009 class \$213,658
- ➤ Total dollars earned by all internship students to date \$6,052,641

To date in the 2008-09 academic year, the Experiential Education & Career Services program helped 1,082 students through both online and in-person résumé workshops. Additionally, our counselors have provided career counseling to 182 students so far in this academic year. This counseling and guidance helps students determine their best career path.
